## New Dog Training Classes at San Diego Humane Society Promote Positive Methods for Encouraging Good Behavior

New Class Offerings Coincide with "National Train Your Dog Month" in January

**SAN DIEGO** — Calling all canines and pet parents! January is "National Train Your Dog Month," which celebrates the importance of giving dogs the structure and routine they thrive on, through positive reinforcement training. Start the New Year off on the right paw with new and enlightening dog training classes, now available at San Diego Humane Society. Whether you have a spry puppy, active adolescent or seasoned senior, classes are available for all skill levels to help you and your pet better understand one another.

"Positive reinforcement training yields a multitude of benefits for both you and your dog. It's the most effective and humane way to help your dog understand what you expect from them. And, equally as important, it teaches them what they can expect from you in return – like treats, praise and belly rubs," says Shauna Romero, Community Training Coordinator at San Diego Humane Society. "This mutual understanding creates a well-behaved pet and also builds a healthier, happier bond between you and your dog."

## **Class offerings:**

- **K9 Nose Work Classes (Scent Detection Training):** Provide an outlet for your dog's energy and natural drive! This class will help to engage your dog's mind, build confidence, provide exercise and create training opportunities, all while giving pet owners the chance to learn and understand the unique qualities of your dog.
- **Marvelous Manners:** An introductory-level course that addresses training areas of immediate concern to dog owners. Course topics include: Loose leash walking, coming when called, greeting without jumping, settle down (calmness in the home), wait for permission, and many more!
- **Superb Skills:** This training class will build on the skills learned in "Marvelous Manners," focusing on differentiating verbal cues from hand signals, as well as adding distance and duration to all behaviors learned in Marvelous Manners.



- **Reliable Rovers:** This training class is designed to challenge both you and your dog. Lessons will focus on strengthening behaviors learned in "Superb Skills" by increasing distance, duration, and distractions. Students will play specialized games that help ensure reliability in a variety of situations.
- **Shy Dog:** An introductory-level course designed for dogs that are overwhelmed by their environment. This class focuses on building trust between you and your dog, as well as boosting your dog's confidence through positive reinforcement training.
- **Puppy Preschool:** This class is designed to meet the training and socialization needs of pups that are 8-18 weeks of age. Owners and their pups learn to adapt to new people, dogs, environments, and experiences.
- **Urban Canine:** Designed for students and their dogs, this class provides the tools necessary to be able to practice the skills learned in training classes out in real life situations. This class is for students who have graduated from a formal obedience class and will be held in a different public location each week.
