**What:** San Diego Humane Society's fourth annual <u>Day of Giving</u>, one of SDHS's largest fundraising efforts of the year, will be on Thursday, June 27. With a goal of raising \$500,000, generous donors are providing more than \$175,000 in matching funds for Day of Giving donations, including gifts made before June 27.

Day of Giving will be celebrated at all SDHS campuses with animal encounters, children's activities and other festivities. Throughout the Day of Giving, owners can get their pets microchipped for free and adoption fees for all animals will be waived. Community Partners—restaurants, breweries, and other businesses—will also be participating by dedicating a portion of sales on June 27 to support San Diego Humane Society.
