
Fall in Love With a Small Pet: \$5 Adoption Promotion

SDHS reduces adoption fees of small pets Sept. 24 – 26 in honor of International Rabbit Day.

SAN DIEGO — San Diego Humane Society is hoping community members will *Fall* in Love with a Small Pet by reducing adoption fees to \$5, in honor of International Rabbit Day on Sept. 26, 2021.

The special promotion from Sept. 24-26 is sponsored by Petco Love to encourage people looking to add a family member to consider adopting a small pet. San Diego Humane Society currently has 67 rabbits, 88 guinea pigs, 11 hamsters, 15 rats and 4 mice available for adoption.

"Rabbits are playful, full of personality and create very strong bonds with their humans," said Dr. Gary Weitzman, president and CEO, San Diego Humane Society. "They also like being with their own kind, so if you are able to adopt in pairs, you are in for a real treat, whether it be with bunnies or any other small animal."
