Adoption fees waived for adult dogs at San Diego Humane Society s Feb. 14-19

SAN DIEGO — It's the season of love, and San Diego Humane Society is welcoming adopters to fall in love at first wag with one of their 220 dogs who are waiting for new homes. To help these deserving pups find their match, the shelter is waiving adoption fees for adult dogs (7 months and older) from Tuesday, Feb. 14 through Sunday, Feb. 19, 2023. The *Find Your Perfect Match* promotion is generously sponsored by Petco Love.

With 435 dogs in care, San Diego Humane Society is currently at 122% capacity for its canine population. The nonprofit is hoping the spirit of love during Valentine's Day will inspire the community to open their hearts and homes to these deserving animals. When you adopt, you change three lives for the better: your life, the life of the pet you bring home and the life of another animal entering the shelter in urgent need of a second chance.
