Humane Officers Investigate Felony Animal Cruelty in University Heights

Crime Stoppers offers reward for information about dog found dead under suspicious circumstances

San Diego – San Diego Humane Society’s Humane Law Enforcement is investigating a felony animal cruelty case in University Heights. Humane Officers responded to a vacant property in the 4700 block of Oregon Street on March 25, 2020 at 1:15 p.m., and found a black and white dog killed under suspicious circumstances. The female Australian cattle dog mix, similar to the photo here, was about 1.5-years old.



“Because this is an open investigation, we cannot discuss details, but we take reports like this very seriously,” said Humane Law Enforcement Chief Bill Ganley. “We rely on community information to help our investigations. It’s the only way we’re able to collect enough evidence to bring animal abusers to justice.”

Crime Stoppers is offering a reward of up to \$1,000 for information that leads to an arrest in this case.
