### Love is in Bloom: Adult Dog Adoption Fees Waived!

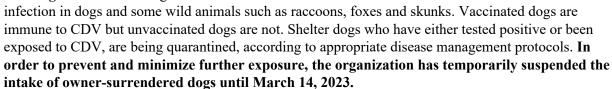
Dogs 7 months+ free to adopt at San Diego Humane Society through March 31, 2023

SAN DIEGO — With the start of Spring just around the corner, *Love is in Bloom* at San Diego Humane Society! At least 244 adult dogs (7 months and older) are available for adoption and waiting for new homes across the organization's campuses in Escondido, El Cajon, Oceanside and San Diego. To help these wonderful pups find a new family, the shelter is waiving adoption fees for adult dogs starting Thursday, March 9 through Friday, March 31, 2023. The *Love is in Bloom* promotion is generously sponsored by Purina.

San Diego Humane Society currently has 558 dogs in care. 98 of those dogs are in foster homes and 460 are at a campus location. Because the shelter only has 350 standard kennels, the shelter is currently at 131% capacity. That means some dogs are housed in non-standard housing, such as in offices and in emergency kennels in conference rooms.

# On top of being over capacity, recent cases of canine distemper virus (CDV), are adding to the

challenge. CDV is a contagious and sometimes fatal viral



The nonprofit is hoping the *Love is in Bloom* adoption promotion will inspire the community to open their hearts and homes to these deserving dogs. When you adopt, you not only change your own life and the life of the pet you bring home for the better, you help the life of another animal entering the shelter in urgent need of a second chance.

San Diego Humane Society is open for walk-in adoptions Tuesday – Sunday, from 10 a.m. – 5 p.m. at its campuses in Escondido, El Cajon, Oceanside and San Diego. Visit <u>sdhumane.org/adopt</u> to view animals available for adoption.

Community members who can't to adopt, can still make a direct impact by:

1. **Fostering a pet temporarily in their home**. Getting shelter pets into foster care frees up critical shelter space. Support is provided every step of the way, and new volunteers can learn more or sign up at <a href="mailto:sdhumane.org/foster">sdhumane.org/foster</a>.
