San Diego Humane Society Closed on Christmas and New Year's Day

Normal Business Hours Will Resume on Dec. 26 and Jan. 3

San Diego – San Diego Humane Society shelters will close at 1 p.m. on Tuesday, Dec. 24, and will reopen for normal business hours on Thursday, Dec. 26. SDHS shelters will also close at 1 p.m. on Tuesday, Dec. 31, and will reopen for <u>normal</u> <u>business hours</u> on Thursday, Jan. 2. If you find a stray pet over the holidays, you have a few options, including:

- If you can, please isolate the animal from your pets, keep them safe overnight and bring them to SDHS the next day during <u>normal business hours</u>.
- If you are unsuccessful in reuniting the pet with their owner, and cannot keep the animal overnight, call your <u>local law enforcement agency</u> and they will contact on-call Humane Officers to assist you.
- If you need to report an animal emergency, please contact your local law enforcement agency.
- If you find an injured or orphaned wild animal, please bring them to <u>Project Wildlife's after-hours drop-off</u> for care.
