
What to Do If You Find a Stray Kitten


SDHS Offers Free Class to Teach Basics of Kitten Care

SAN DIEGO — As Kitten Season approaches this spring, shelters all over the country are preparing for an influx of young kittens, and members of the public are more likely to come across stray kittens.

<u>San Diego Humane Society recommends the following tips</u> if you find stray kittens:

- 1. **Watch** to assess whether the kittens are sick or injured. If so, take them to a veterinary clinic immediately.
- 2. **Wait** to see if mom comes back. If she doesn't return within six hours, it's time to intervene.
- 3. **Evaluate** the appropriate next steps. Are you willing to take full responsibility for the kittens? If not, bring them to your local shelter.
