

Whether they are a pet companion or a service animal helping someone to perform a specific task, animals play an important role in many people's lives. At San Diego Humane Society, we have animal ambassadors that help us with our Pet-Assisted Therapy and Education programs. Our ambassadors regularly visit hospitals, nursing homes and places where people may be in need of some extra animal love. They also go to schools to help teach children all about animals! The animals in our program are selected because of their extra sweet and calm nature and are typically rabbits, guinea pigs and rats. We also have dogs, called Canine Ambassadors, who attend these programs with their guardians. To become a Canine Ambassador, the dog has to pass a test, but most of all enjoy getting lots of loving pets from strangers!

Lend a Paw



Make a wood chew for our Pet-Assisted Therapy and Education Animal Ambassadors!

Materials:

- Sisal rope
- Scissors
- Untreated wood pieces
- Drill (may be needed if wood pieces don't have holes)
- Optional items: popsicle sticks, untreated wicker, cardboard, raffia, bells
- **Note:** If you use colored wood, please make sure that it is non-toxic.

Instructions:

- 1. Cut the sisal rope so it is about 12 inches in length.
- 2. Tie a knot at the top.
- 3. String wood shapes or other items on the rope in any way you want. Get creative!
- 4. Tie a small knot underneath each wood shape or item to prevent it from slipping down.
- 5. When finished tying on all pieces, tie a knot at the bottom of your length of rope. Add a bell for some added fun!
